#### **June**

"For you have spent enough time in the past doing what pagans choose to do-living in debauchery, lust, drunkenness, orgies, carousing and detestable idolatry. They are surprised that you do not join them in their reckless, wild living, and they heap abuse on you. But they will have to give account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead.-1 Peter 4:3-5

# **Indianapolis Missions**

Most of the Forgotten Ministries team traveled to Indianapolis, Indiana to help with NAMB's weekend of outreaches called "crossover." The weekend was very similar to what a Send Relief Tour looks like. There several different outreaches that churches and individuals can sign-up for. The grill walk was one of the outreaches. We did a total of three grill walks throughout the weekend in areas of Indianapolis that most people would avoid for safety reasons. We partnered with a church called "Living Faith Church" which has existed for about 9 years. They have planted two churches in the roughest areas of Indianapolis and are planning to plant several more. On one of the grill walks, we went to an area where they are planning to plant a church in the near future. The church team and everyone who able to ioined were have gospel conversations in a community that seemed forgotten. The pastors wife stood back and watched in awe to see that the people were actually open to having conversations because they weren't in the past. She was so thankful everyone was there to support them in their





-efforts to reach out to this community. On one of the grill walks, one of the staff shared the Gospel with a 12 year old girl who said she had never heard of what Jesus had done for her before. Her eyes were open to the Gospel for the first time that day and she went home with a bible. There were a handful of salvations on each grill walk. However, what seemed to impact our team the most were interactions we had outside of the designated ministry times. There were so many lost souls, it was overwhelming. The kids on our team wanted to cross the street to pray with people even though they didn't have to. When you are willing to be used by God, He will give you opportunities everywhere, you just have to take them. Even in moments where there were threats of danger on this trip, God continued to be faithful and we were able to proclaim his truths and encourage others to do the same! We were all very encouraged by Living Faith Church and the work they are doing in Indianapolis!
