Sleigh Walks

From December 16th to the 22nd, we had an outreach every night in different areas of Enid, Oklahoma. We had a grill, hamburgers, a Trailor decorated as a sleigh, Christmas gifts, and the message of the Gospel! Each night, different churches and volunteers partnered with us to go out and deliver the food, gifts, and the Gospel. We went to a neighborhood in East Enid, Pheasant Run Apartments, Willow Apartments, Pine Manor apartments, the neighborhood by Coolidge School, and downtown Enid. We had over 100 volunteers from 9 churches help make all of this possible this week.

On the first Sleigh Walk of the week, there was a woman standing outside in her front yard talking on the phone and looking at all the commotion. When someone went up to talk to her, she didn't need any of the stuff we were giving out, but she needed a church. So she got connected with the pastor on the Sleigh Walk whose church is just down the road from her house. The Lord knew what she needed.

At another house that week, Jeremiah and Brandon knocked on the door to find a man who said he was just in the middle of praying for help when he was interrupted with a knock on his door. They had just moved there after losing their son. His wife was out looking for help at the church at that very moment. God knew what they needed.

Near Coolidge, a woman was trying to drive by but the Trailor was blocking her way. As she waited, some volunteers asked her if she needed prayer. The tears began to fall down her face as they prayed with her and she got connected with a church. God knew what she needed!

At another door, there was a son who had just moved there to care for his father who had Alzheimer's. They were able to pray with him and share the good news with him. God knew what he needed.

A group of volunteers knocked on a door and a young child, no older than 8 was home alone with their two younger siblings. They weren't supposed to open the door, but the neighbor came over and helped and said it must have been a couple days since they had last eaten and they definitely wouldn't be getting any Christmas gifts either. They gave food and gifts to the kids and shined the light of Jesus into their lives that night. God saw them and knew what they needed, He always knows.
