

Season Launches May 8 with Andrew Heyward's Urgent Talk: "From Cronkite to Crisis"

BARNSTABLE, MA – The Cape Cod Speaker Series returns this spring with its much-anticipated second season, bringing leading voices in journalism, diplomacy, politics, and climate to the Cape community. Designed to spark meaningful dialogue around today's most urgent issues, the 2025 season features four thought-provoking evenings

with prominent national figures and renowned experts.

What happened to journalism – and how can we save it? In this urgent and timely talk, Andrew Heyward, former President of CBS News and senior advisor at MIT's Center for Constructive Communication, explores the shattered media landscape, the collapse of public trust, Washington's newest threats to news organizations and press freedom, and the path toward a more constructive future. Drawing on decades of newsroom experience and his current work with local TV stations, Heyward offers a compelling roadmap for restoring this pillar of democracy.
