

Aspire Indiana Health is pleased to welcome Dr. Juan Jaramillo, a veteran psychiatrist, to our behavioral health team. He will see adult patients in Aspire's Indianapolis and Lebanon clinics once pandemic restrictions lift, providing psychiatric medication management and evaluation via telehealth video appointment until then. A native of Colombia, South America, he will also help serve patients who prefer to receive therapy in Spanish.

He joins us from the University of Tennessee Health Science Center where he served as Assistant Professor, a position that also included coverage at Regional One Hospital and consultation services to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Additionally he served as Assistant Medical Director at Lourdes Hospital in Paducah, Ky., where he covered both inpatient and outpatient services, and provided consultation services to the general hospital.

Jaramillo completed his medical degree at the Universidad Pontificia Bolivariana and emigrated to the U.S. in 1992. He completed his Psychiatric residency training at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York. In addition, Dr. Jaramillo completed a Fellowship in Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry and has done additional training in the field of Child

Psychiatry.

He has lived in Carmel since 2019 with his wife, Isabel, and stepdaughter, Juana, along with two cats, Callie and Gemma. He also has two sons, Daniel and Santiago, who still live in Memphis. His passions include attending the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra and the Indianapolis Zoo.

says. I love the moment when my work pays off, when we get the email or the letter that says a proposal I poured my heart


double the grant amount requested.

I was 5 years old. My uncle was the very first deaf U.S. Postal Service mail carrier, and he had to sue the USPS so he would be allowed to have the job. So I know a little bit about the discrimination and isolation deaf people face on a daily basis.

"I would love to see our Deaf Services receive the recognition and funding that they deserve, because deaf people are so often overlooked."


