## RESOLUTION #2016-01 Establishing Split Shifts for Election Officials

Section 7.32, Wis. stats. Allows a municipal governing body to reduce the required number of election officials at a polling place from seven (7) to no less than three (3), and the town board has determined that it would be advantageous to the town to have only as many election officials on duty as are needed for a given election.

Therefore, the Town Board of the Town of Spruce, Oconto County, Wisconsin, by this resolution, adopted by a majority of the town board on a roll call vote with a quorum present, and voting and proper notice having been given, resolves and declares as follows:

- A. There shall be a minimum of three (3) election officials on duty at every election. At the discretion of the town derk, the requisite number of election officials may be increased for any election. However, the number of election officials working at a given election shall always be an odd number.
- B. As deemed necessary by the town derk, this resolution provides for the selection of two
   (2) or more sets of at least three (3) election officials to work at different times on each
   Election Day as follows:
  - a. There may be two (2) shifts for election workers on any or all election days. The second shift shall end with the completion of all required Election Day duties that follow the closure of the polls.
  - b. Election workers may work both shifts.
- C. The town board may for each election appoint one additional election inspector. The additional election inspector shall serve as a greeter to answer questions, and to direct electors to the proper locations for registration and voting and shall be available to substitute for other election officials who must leave the room during the voting process.

The town derk shall properly post or publish this resolution as required under s. 60.80, Wis. Stats.
