day 1

LUKE 9:18-22

DWELL

News was spreading about Jesus' miracles and teachings, and people were making theories about who He could be. But none of the major theories going around were quite right. After the disciples told Jesus what the crowds were saying, He essentially asked them, "Do you agree with what the crowds are saying about Me?" The disciples had been closest to Him, so they should have the best understanding. Peter answered and told Him their correct answer: "God's Messiah." But Jesus wasn't ready for the religious leaders to hear this, so He instructed His disciples to not tell anyone what they knew about His identity.

← Why was it important for the disciples to understand who Jesus truly was?

↔ What are some theories you've heard about who Jesus is [such as "a wise teacher"]? Why is it important for us to understand who He truly is?

MEMORIZE

Write Luke 9:23 on a note card and place it in a folder or binder where you will see it frequently. Read it to yourself each time you see it this week.

PRAY

Thank God that He sent us so much more than a wise teacher or another prophet to restore our relationship with Him.

day 2

LUKE 9:23-27

DWELL

Following Jesus is not an easy path. Most of us will not be called to physically die for our faith—although there are still people around the world who are doing just that. However, the kind of death Jesus is talking about in verse 24 isn't simply the death of our bodies. Jesus is talking about "putting to death"—trading in—our selfish desires to live for our own enjoyment and gain, and instead living with a different set of priorities—following His teachings.

↻ Rewrite verses 23-25 in your own words.

→ Which parts of the instructions in these verses are the hardest for you to follow?

MEMORIZE

Read Luke 9:23 aloud to yourself slowly and carefully, taking time to hear each word. Do this one or two times a day until you can do it from memory.

PRAY

Ask Jesus to show you how to deny yourself and take up your cross to follow Him this week.

day 3

LUKE 9:28-36

DWELL

If there was still any question in the minds of these three disciples about Jesus' identity, this event should have put those doubts to rest. But Peter's response to seeing Jesus with Moses and Elijah shows that he still did not understand. By offering to build temporary shelters for all three of them, he was suggesting that they should each be treated with equal reverence—not giving Jesus the elevated sense of honor owed to Him. The cloud that appeared then was no ordinary cloud, but the cloud of God's presence, audibly confirming Jesus' identity as His Son.

← Why do you think Jesus took some of his disciples up on the mountaintop with him that day?

↑ What do the events in these passages tell us about Jesus?

MEMORIZE

Take a few moments to silently recite as much of Luke 9:23 as you can remember from memory when you are waiting in lines or in other quiet moments of your days this week.

PRAY

Ask God to forgive you for the times that you honor other people or things above Jesus.

day 4

LUKE 9:37-45

DWELL

By now, Jesus' followers should have been familiar with His power and authority to heal and drive out demons. But His disciples did not have that same authority, and were unable to drive out the demons themselves. Despite all they had seen and experienced, those who were with Jesus did not fully believe in His power and authority, or understand just who He was. Jesus then made things even more confusing—after displaying His power by driving out the demon, He then told His disciples He was about to be betrayed. This didn't match their idea of who the Messiah was supposed to be!

↓ Why do you think the disciples were afraid to ask Jesus what He meant (vv. 44-45)?

→ The disciples believed things about Jesus that matched who they wanted the Messiah to be. Do you ever make Jesus into who you want Him to be? How so?

MEMORIZE

Ask a friend or family member to quiz you as you recite Luke 9:23 to them from memory. They can give you the next word of the verse if you need help remembering.

PRAY

Pray that Jesus would help show you the ways that you misunderstand who He is.

day 5

LUKE 9:57-62

DWELL

As we learned on day 2, following Jesus is not always easy. In these verses, He explained that to some people who thought they wanted to follow Him, but did not like His answers when they asked Him how they could do that. We cannot choose to follow Jesus sometimes but then go our own way other times—following His ways requires absolute commitment. It also means that life will not always be comfortable, and we will live in ways that are strange to the people around us.

← What did Jesus mean when He said, "Foxes have dens, and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head" (v. 58)?

↻ What is the hardest part about following Jesus for you? Pray that God would help you in this area.

MEMORIZE

Use colored pens, pencils, or markers to draw Luke 9:23 colorfully on a piece of paper or note card, and place it somewhere you can see it often. You can use stickers or cutouts from magazines to decorate it if you'd like.

PRAY

Thank God that even though following Jesus is sometimes difficult, He promises that He will always be with us.
