FAMILY devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: SCRIPTURE

We love hero stories. In most of these stories the hero has some power, gift, or ability that allows her or him to solve problems, fight crime, or save people from certain disaster in ways no one else can. Today we will see that Jesus had the power and ability to save people in a way that no one else could, from an enemy far more deadly than any other. Jesus would save people from their sin and He would do it in an incredibly surprising way—by submitting to God's plan of redemption at great cost to Himself.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

What did Jesus ask God for in verse 42. Did God give Jesus what He asked for? Explain.

Why is it important that we take time in prayer to ask God to help us trust and submit to His will?

PRAY: Ask God to give you the courage to seek and submit to His will for your life.
